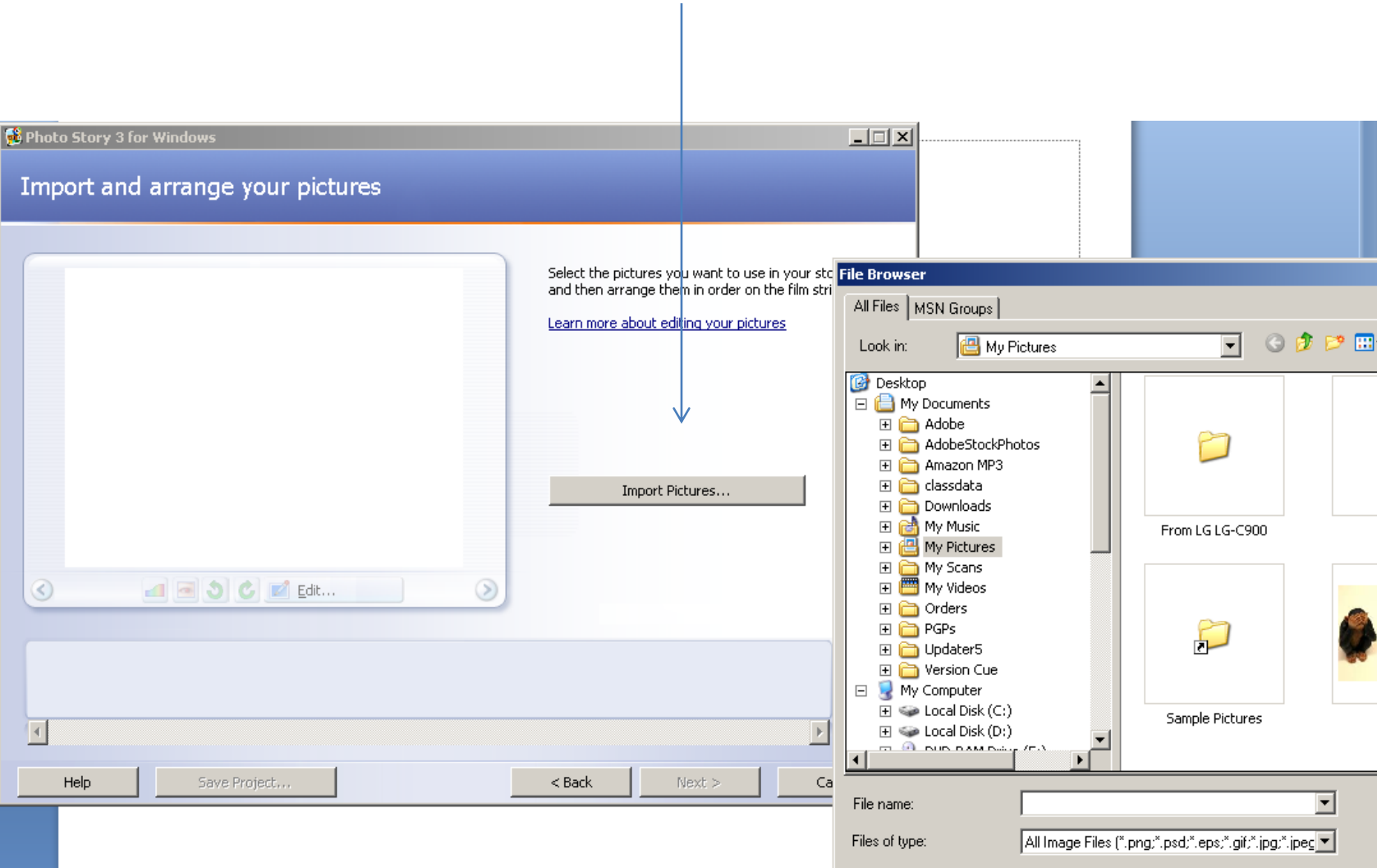


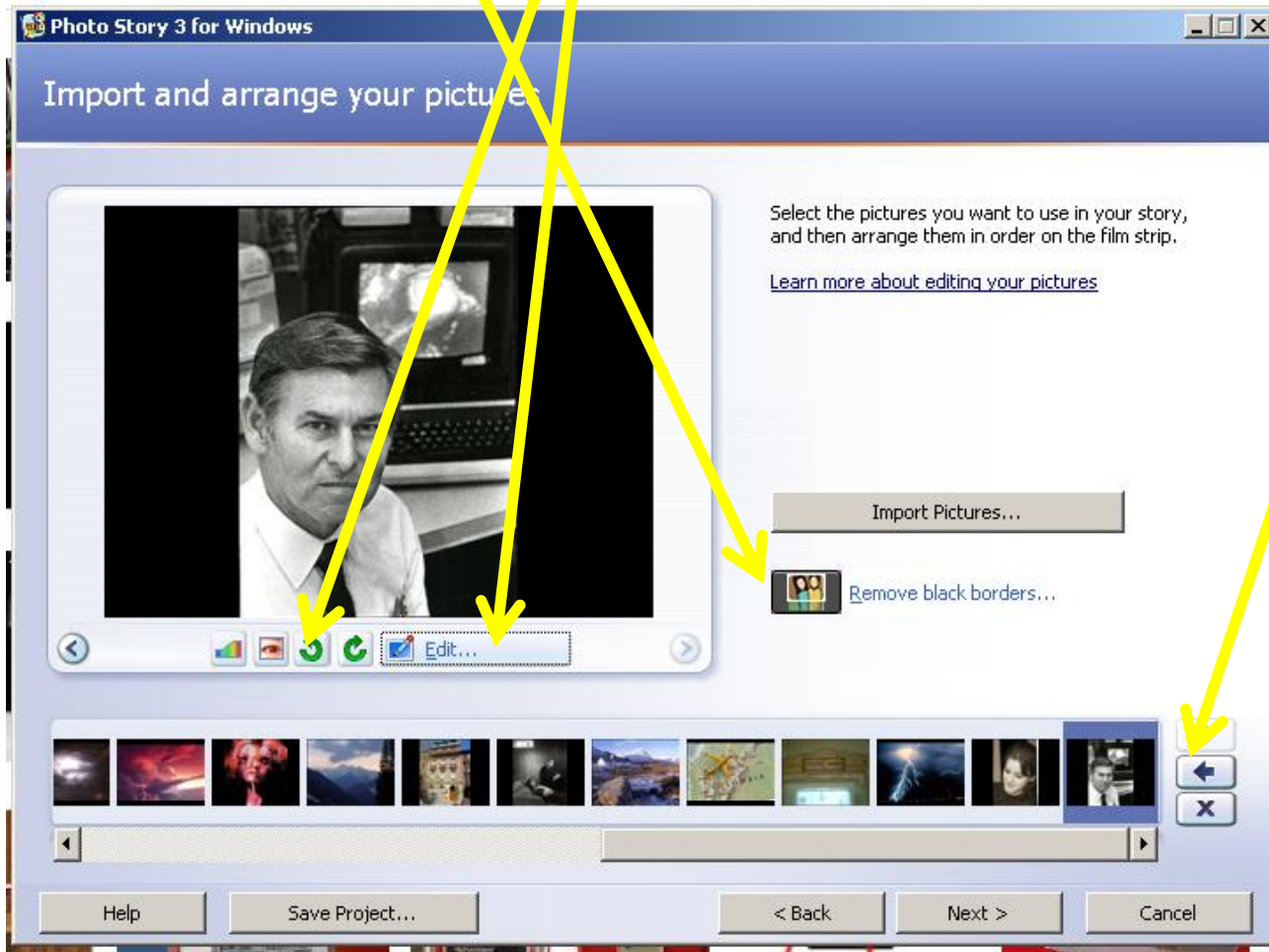
PHOTOSTORY 3 –WINDOWS XP



Import Pictures—Include a colored box for text.

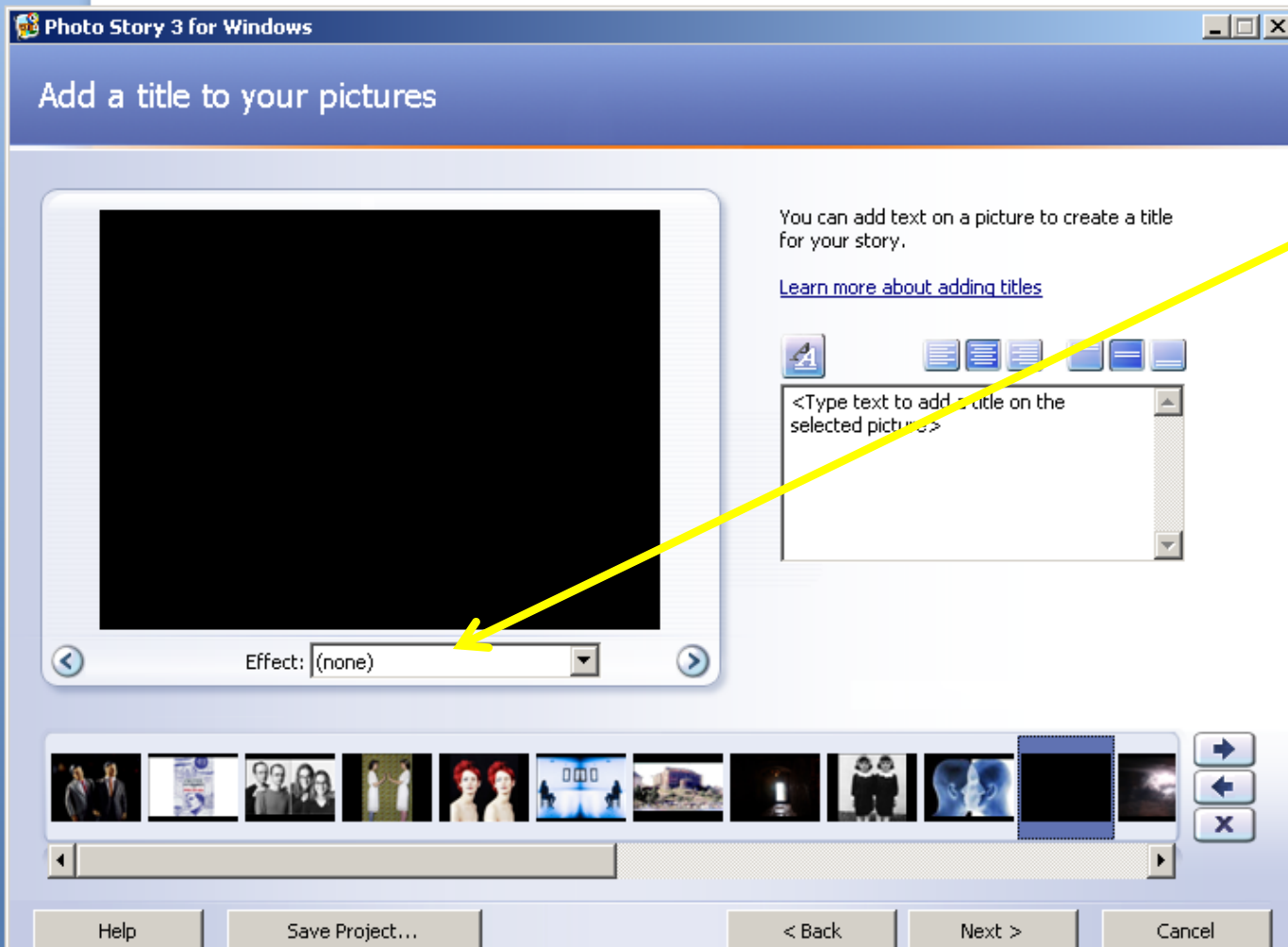


You can do simple editing (rotating, red eye, auto levels), remove black borders from pictures,



Or arrange the order of pictures by using the arrow keys or simply clicking and dragging.

Add text. This is where that nifty colored box comes in handy. You have little control over the placement of text. Text over pictures can be difficult to read.

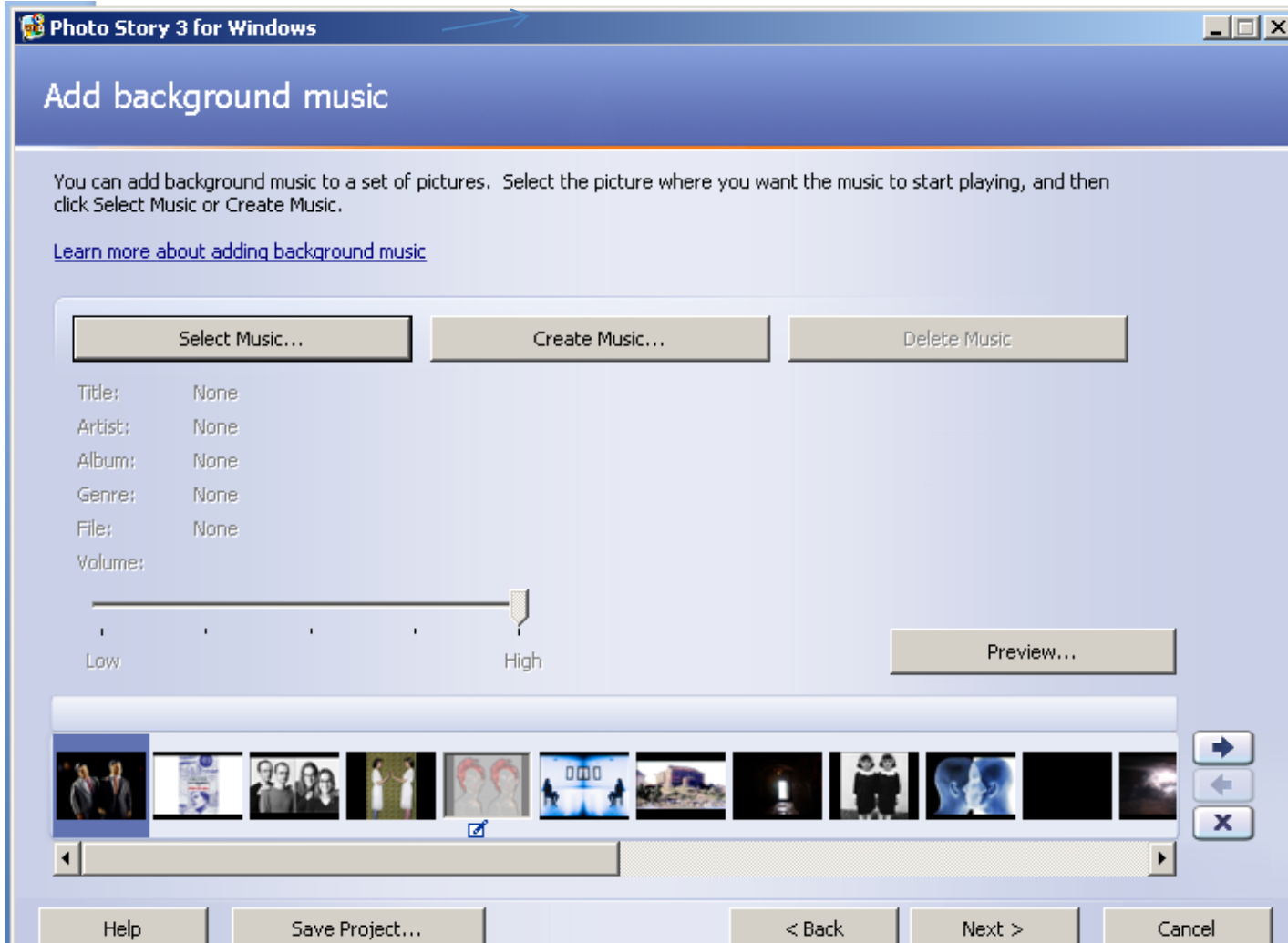


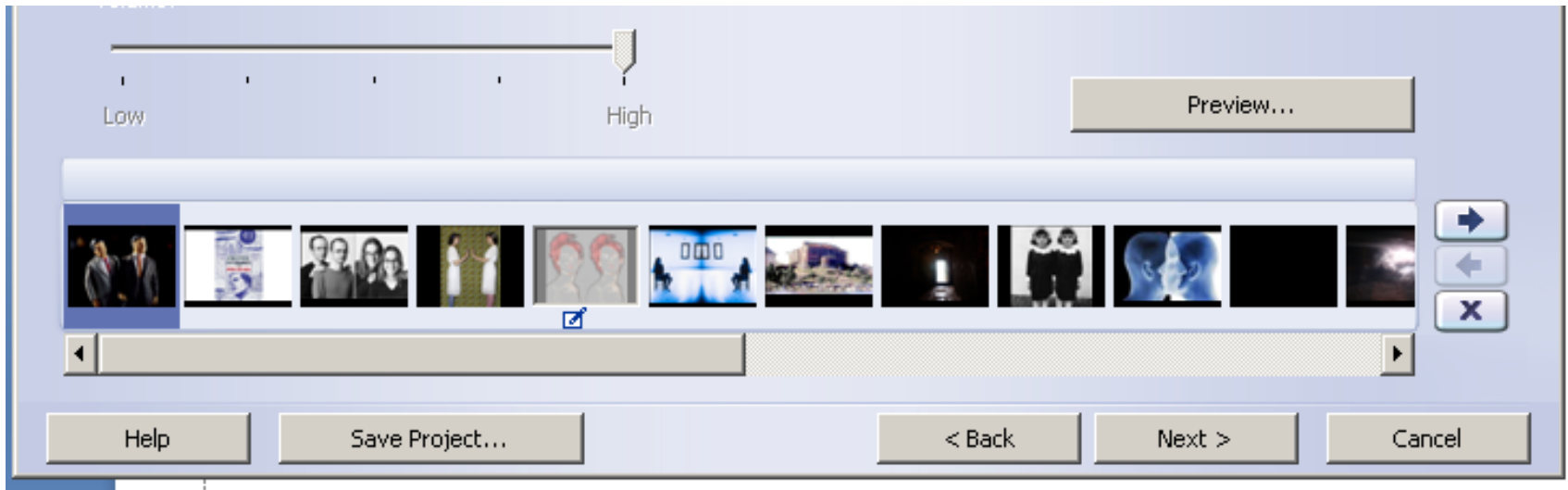
Effects can be added to images here.

You can record your own audio (not recommended) here, as well as customize the length of the clips and the transitions.

You can add music by uploading your own or by generating music provided by the program. PhotoStory adjusts the length of the music to fit the video.





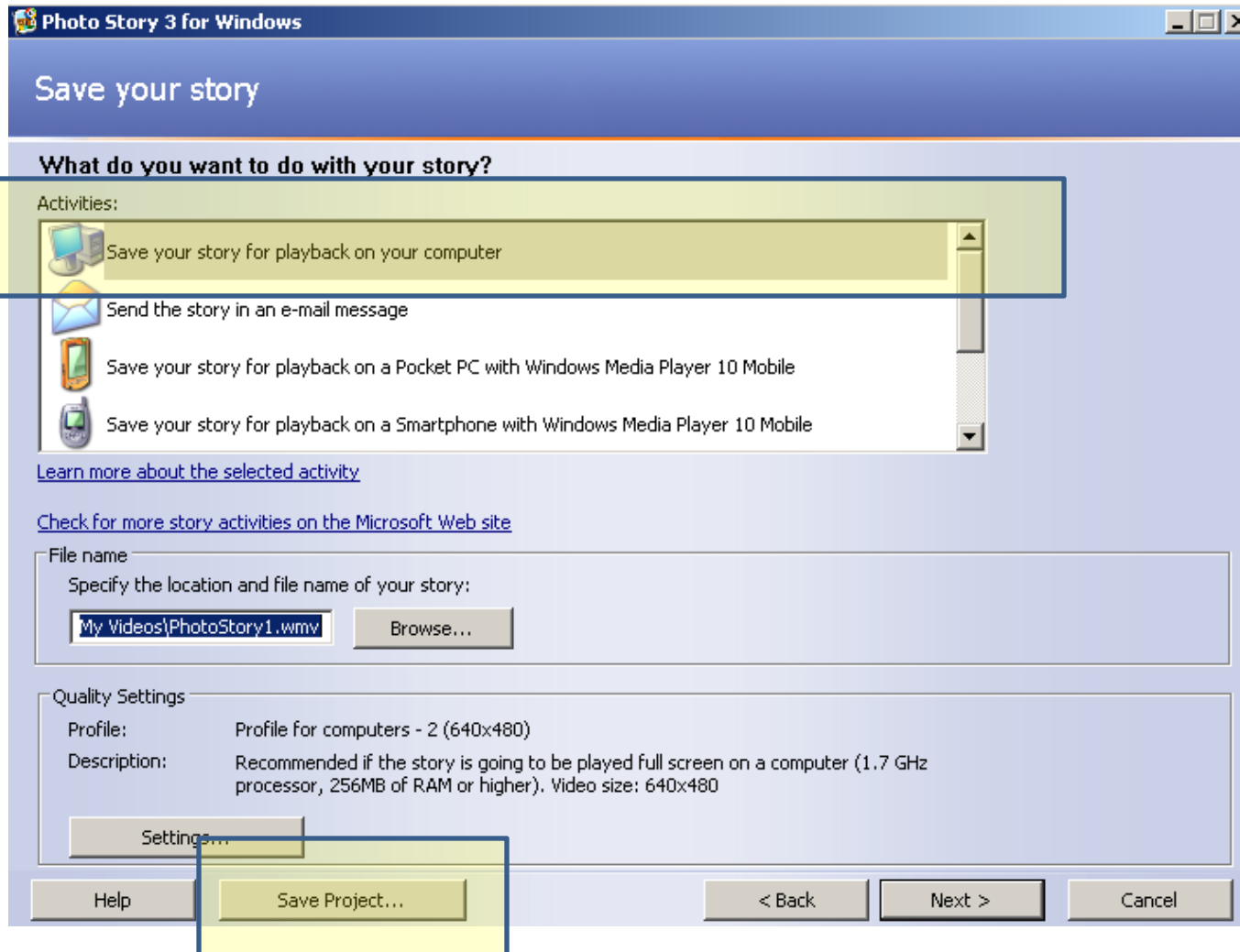
SAVE PROJECT on EVERY PAGE.
